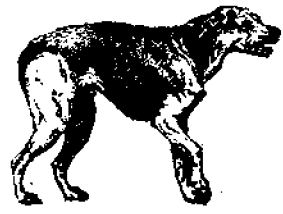

## REGULATIONS FOR

# CRUFT'S 33rd GREAT INTERNATIONAL DOG SHOW

February 7th, 8th, and 9th, 1917, at the

**AGRICULTURAL HALL, LONDON.**

SUBJECT TO KENNEL CLUB RULES.

**VICIOUS DOGS** are not eligible, and must not be sent to the Show. Exhibitors are responsible for any damage done by their Dogs during the Exhibition.

- 1. The Show** will be held under the Rules of the K.C., as revised March 7th, 1916.
- 2. Entries.**—All Entries must be made on or before **Monday, January 22nd, 1917**. upon Certificates to be issued for that purpose. Each Exhibitor must fill in a separate form, otherwise the entry may not be accepted. The Prize Lists and Certificates of Entry can be obtained on application at the Royal Agricultural Hall and at 12, Highbury Grove, N. Entries may be made in first instance by RAILWAY LETTER, TELEGRAM, or EXPRESS DELIVERY LETTER. MESSAGERS may be called by Telephone or Private Wire from nearest Post Office. Evidence must be given of dispatch on **January 22nd**. Acknowledgment of Entries will be sent with the labels.
- 3. Entry Fees.**—The Entrance Fee for each Dog is 11s. for each Class entered in. Entrance Fee for Brace and Team Classes is 11s. for each Brace or Team.  
**Entrance Fee for Auction.**—Dogs entered previously in the ordinary classes, 2s. 6d.; for one Dog in Auction only, 11s.; all after the first entry, 2s. 6d. Special Terms for large entries for Auction. Entries for Auction may be made up to February 8th, 1917, for Dogs already entered for competition.
- 4. Cheques** from Scotland, the Channel Islands, and Ireland must be made out for 6d. extra, the Bankers' charge for collection. Register all Treasury Notes.
- 5. Power to Refuse Entries.**—The Committee reserve to themselves the right to refuse any Entries that they may think fit to exclude.
- 6. Power to exclude Dogs.**—The Committee will be empowered to exclude or remove any Dog which, in their opinion, is not in a fit state for exhibition, either from disease, vice, or any other cause. The Secretary will not accept by post keys of baskets or packages; they must be attached to the package. No Dog will be received if sent in a box, hamper, or other package, locked, unless the key be fastened to the lock by a chain or wire. Packages nailed or tied with rope or strap will not be received. The Regulation Hamper or Box is recommended.
- 7. Labels.**—Address Labels, with instructions for sending Dogs to the Show, will be forwarded to Exhibitors in due course. Should they not arrive, Dogs should be sent to the Show and the Secretary advised, as no fees will be returned.
- 8. Safety of Dogs.**—The Committee will be most anxious for the care and safety of the Dogs sent for Exhibition, or any other property entrusted to them; but it must be distinctly understood by Exhibitors and all other persons that the Committee will not be responsible for the loss, detention of, or damage to any Dogs or other property, whether arising from accident or other cause whatever, or from any act or omission of themselves, their officers, agents, servants, or others, or the damage done by the Exhibits (Dogs) to any person or property.
- 9. Chains.**—All Dogs must be forwarded with a strong **SHOW CHAIN** and plain leather collar. There must be two spring hooks, three swivels, and two rings to each chain, to which must be attached (six inches from collar) the metal tally, otherwise they may not be received.
- 10.—This Show will be open to the World**, whether they are Subscribing Members or not, and they may compete for the Class Prizes; but the competition for the Challenge Trophies and other special Prizes given by the Committee shall be confined to Members of Cruft's International Dog Show Society, except where otherwise stated. **SUBSCRIPTION** to the Society is One Guinea, but when Exhibitors wish to compete for special Prizes offered in various breeds, the fee is One Guinea per breed.
- 11. Exhibitors' Free Passes.**—Exhibitors will receive a Pass, which is available on any day of the Exhibition. This Pass will be sent with the labels; it will admit the Exhibitor or his agent to the Exhibition any time the Show is open to the public. Any Exhibitor found lending or improperly transferring Pass shall be liable to forfeit any Prize or Prizes he may have won.
- 12. Keepers' Passes.**—Servant's pass can be had at the charge of 3s. (including tax) each for *bona-fide* servants only, who are solely engaged to attend Exhibitors' Dogs. These

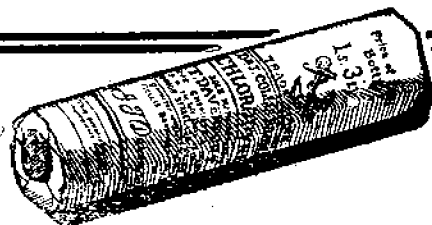

passes **MUST BE APPLIED FOR WHEN MAKING ENTRIES**, and servant's name given, and will **NOT BE ISSUED AFTER JANUARY 22nd**. If found improperly transferring pass it will be cancelled. Exhibitors entering three or more Dogs will be sent one pass free.

13. **Weighing.**—In Classes where there is a fixed limit, all Dogs will be weighed in accordance with Kennel Club Rule 6.

14. **Food.**—The Dogs will be fed and attended to free of expense to the Exhibitor during the Exhibition.

15. **Arrival of Dogs.**—The Dogs must be at the place of Exhibition not before 7 a.m. or after 9.45 a.m. **Wednesday Morning, February 7th**, after which hour the Committee will not undertake to receive Dogs. The Officials will receive Dogs **after 2 p.m. on Tuesday, February 6th**. Arrangements have been made with all Railway Companies to deliver the Dogs to the Royal Agricultural Hall; all charges to be defrayed by Exhibitors. The Dogs will be received at the entrance doors by the officials. No van, cab, or vehicle will be admitted to the yard after 9 a.m. on the 7th. Dogs led on chain will be received until 10 a.m. Those leading such Dogs must be provided with a pass, otherwise they must hand the dog over to an official (at the entrance) appointed by the Committee. The Show is open from 10 a.m. to 10 p.m., except Friday, when the Show closes at 6 p.m. The Railways will carry Dogs as usual.

16. **Judging.**—The judging will take place on **Wednesday, February 7th**, and following day.

17. **Judges' Decision.**—The decision of the Judges will in all cases be final, except where misrepresentation or breach of the Rules is discovered, or a *bona fide* mistake is made. Should any Judge be prevented from fulfilling his engagement, the Committee reserve to themselves the right of appointing another Judge to fulfil the duties. (Vide K.C. Rules 5 and 6a.)

18. **Judges empowered to withhold Prizes.**—The Judges will be instructed and empowered to withhold the Prize or Prizes in any class if, in their opinion, the Dog or Dogs exhibited do not possess sufficient merit (See K.C. Rule 6a). Any Member being in arrears with his or her Subscription on the 22nd day of January shall not be eligible to compete for any Prize confined to Members of Crufts or to participate in any Privilege of Membership.

19. **Judges are not empowered to give Prizes beyond those offered in this Schedule of Prizes.** Any such award shall not have any value, or count as a win, except the consent of the Secretary be first obtained in writing. The awards as published in Catalogue are E. and O.E.

20. **Special Prizes.**—No Team or Brace can compete, or win a Special given for Brace or Team, unless entered in Brace or Team Class, neither can a Special Prize offered for best Puppy, or Novice, be won or be competed for unless the winner is entered in the respective Class. Exhibitors competing for Special Prizes should have their Dogs ready as soon as the judging of the classes is completed, as, under the varying conditions, the Committee will not be responsible should by any circumstance a dog not come before the Judge for any particular Special Prize.

21. **Sale of Dogs.**—Exhibitors may state on the Entry Form the price at which they are prepared to sell their Dogs, and the sale must take place at the discretion of the Committee if an offer be made to purchase at the price fixed. A commission of 10 per cent. will be charged upon all Sales, which must be effected through the Sale Office of the Show. If not for sale that should be stated on the Entry Form. Exhibitors may reduce the price of their Dogs (after 4 p.m. on the first day of the Show) upon giving notice to the Secretary who will furnish them with a card upon which the reduced price will be marked, at a charge of 1s. each. No other notice will be allowed to be placed over the Dogs. The Commission will be charged on the actual price obtained for the Dog; should it be found that an Exhibitor has sold any of his Dogs without the Secretary's knowledge, the Committee shall have power to recover. (Subject to K.C. Rule 11.)

22. **Purchase of Dogs.**—Any person may put in a claim for a Dog at the price set forth in the Catalogue before 4 p.m. on the first day of the Show; such claim must be in writing and under cover and on a special form (which can be obtained at the Sale Office), and be accompanied by a deposit of 20 per cent. of the price of the dog. At 4 p.m. precisely, claims shall be opened by the Secretary (or authorised official), and should there be two or more claimants for the same Dog, the Committee shall at their discretion have such dog or dogs sold either by Auction or by Tender, and any surplus thereon shall be equally divided between the Exhibitor and the Committee, and the deposits of unsuccessful claimants returned. After 4 p.m., the first claimant shall be considered the buyer, provided he fills in and signs the requisition as furnished by the Society for the purpose. No Dog shall be deemed to be sold until the purchaser shall have paid to the Secretary the amount agreed upon. This regulation does not apply to the Auction Sale (Subject to K.C. Rule 11).

23. **Removing Dogs without Leave.**—Any person refusing to bench his or her Dog or Dogs when requested to do so by an official of the Show, will be reported to the K.C. and

MAY forfeit any Prize or Prizes they may have won. Dogs may be exercised in the appointed places before 10 a.m. or between 5.30 p.m. and 6.30 p.m., and at no other time.

**24. Removing Dogs at Night.**—Exhibitors will be permitted to take home their Dogs each evening after the Show is closed on leaving a deposit of 21s. for each Dog; of which sum 20s. will be refunded on return of each Dog next day at 10 a.m. This deposit will be forfeited if the Dog is not returned before 10 o'clock every morning the Show is open, and if the winner of a Prize is taken out and not punctually returned, the Prize or Prizes will also be forfeited. Puppies whose age is under 12 months may be finally removed at the end of the first day of the Show.

**25.** For the convenience of Exhibitors, Dogs may be removed from the Show (provided all other regulations are complied with) on the 1st day by payment of 7s. 6d. at 4 p.m. and 5s. at 7 p.m., and on the 2nd day by payment of 5s. at 4 p.m. and 2s. 6d. at 7 p.m., and by payment of 2/6 at 4 p.m. on 3rd day. The Early Orders must be obtained at the Secretary's office. Exhibitors are particularly requested not to avail themselves of this concession, unless it is of great importance to them to do so; it is only framed to meet very exceptional cases. (See Regulation 24)

**26. Despatch of Dogs.**—Should Exhibitors desire to have their Dogs despatched on Friday night, they should send their removal orders duly signed to the Railway Company's officials in London, instructing them to collect and forward, at the same time stating if on chain, in box, or hamper. Exhibitors or their agents can remove their Dogs on presentation of the proper authority as soon as the Show closes.

**27.** All Rules, Regulations, Definitions, or Instructions of the nature of Rules or Regulations printed for convenience in other parts of this Schedule shall be deemed to be Regulations of Cruft's Dog Show, and shall have the same effect as if they formed part of the Regulations.

**28.** Should any question arise not provided for by these Regulations or by the Kennel Club Rules, the decision of the Committee thereon shall be final, subject only to appeal to the Kennel Club. All complaints or inquiries must be made in writing and left at Secretary's office.

**29.** An announcement (prior to Jan. 22nd) in *The Field*, *Our Dogs*, or *Kennel News*, of any alteration or addition made by the Committee in this Schedule, or in these Regulations, shall be deemed full and sufficient notice thereof.

**30.** Every Exhibitor making an entry or entries at or for this Show shall be deemed to have agreed to abide by the Kennel Club Rules printed herein, and by the Regulations, and it is on this understanding only that entries are received. Special Conditions as to terms of entry and any alteration or condition imposed by an Exhibitor, other than those printed in the Schedule, cannot be accepted; any such alteration will be treated as void.

**31. Correspondence.**—All correspondence, inquiries, and Subscriptions will be received by CHARLES CRUFT between October 1st, 1916, and June 1st, 1917. Correspondents requiring replies by telegram must prepay same. The Secretary's Offices at the Hall are only open from February 6th to 10th inclusive. Letters and Telegrams for Exhibitors should be addressed Poste Restante, P.O., Agricultural Hall, and not c/o Secretary.

**THERE IS A POST AND TELEGRAPH OFFICE IN THE HALL.**

Anyone requiring a Catalogue with awards, which will be Posted before NOON on February 8th, should send 2s. in Stamps or Postal Order to the Secretary.

N.B.—Letters containing Treasury Notes should be registered.

been changed. No dog under 12 months of age to be eligible for competition. Only winners of a First Prize on the day of competition to be eligible to compete for these Prizes. The Committee will give a Prize Medal or other suitable Prize to each winner at each Show where the Challenge Bowls are in competition.

"CHALLENGE CUPS" given in the following breeds are subject to same conditions as "Cruft's International Challenge Bowls":—Danes, Mastiffs, Spaniels, Pomeranians, Pekingese.

### Conditions for the Competition for the "CRUFT" CHALLENGE TEAM CUPS.

1. The competition for these Cups shall be confined to the various breeds of Terriers and Dogs, and shall be offered for competition at such Shows as the Committee may elect, but they shall not be offered for competition less than once in each year, and be confined to S.C.S.

2. Each Cup will be offered for the best Team of three or more exhibits of one breed of Terrier or Dog the property of the same Exhibitor (the sexes may be mixed). The competing Dogs must be entered in their respective Classes and also in the Team Class for the breed to which they belong—and the Exhibitor may compete with any number of Teams.

3. An Exhibitor who has previously won one of these "Cruft" Challenge Cups shall not be allowed to compete for it again a second time with the same Dogs, but must include in his Team at least one or more exhibits which did not compete in any former Team.

4. An Exhibitor winning one of the "Cruft" Challenge Cups for the first time shall be entitled to receive a Medal or Miniature, and the like should he win it a second time; but should the Exhibitor win it a third time he shall be entitled to receive a Silver Cup value Two Guineas, or a piece of plate of equal value, and the like for a fourth win, but should an Exhibitor win it a fifth time he shall be entitled to the said "Cruft" Challenge Cup, and have and retain same.

### Conditions for the Competition for the WARWICK VASE.

1. The Vase will be offered for Competition not less than once in each year at such Shows as the Committee of Cruft's shall decide, and the Competition confined to Members of Cruft's International Dog Show Society.

2. That the winner for the time being shall hold the Vase until it is again offered for competition. That the winner shall, if required, give solvent security for the Vase. Should the Vase get damaged it will be restored to same condition as when handed to winner, at his expense.

3. That the Warwick Vase be offered for the best Collie, bred by exhibitor. The Committee will give a Prize Medal to each winner at each Show where the Vase is offered for competition. A Replica can be obtained.

The FOREIGN TROPHIES and CHAIRMAN'S CUPS. Same Conditions as for the Cruft Challenge Bowl.

### Conditions for the Competition for the NEWCASTLE CHALLENGE CUP.

1. The Cup will be offered for competition not less than once in each year. The Newcastle Challenge Cup is offered for best Fox Terrier (wire or smooth) the property of a Member of Cruft's, provided it wins first in its class.

2. That the winner for the time being shall hold the Cup until it is again offered for competition. That the winner shall, if required, give solvent security. Should the Cup get damaged it will have to be returned to same condition as when handed to winner, at his expense.

### Conditions for the "HAMILTON LEIGH" CHALLENGE CUP (Value 10 guineas).

1. The Cup will be offered for competition not less than once in each year.

2. That the winner for the time being shall hold the Cup until it is again offered for competition. That the winner shall, if required, give solvent security for the Cup. Should the Cup get damaged, it will have to be restored to same condition as when handed to winner, at his expense.

3. The "Hamilton Leigh" Challenge Cup is for the best Borzoi, bred and exhibited by a Member of Cruft's, provided it wins first in its class.

### Conditions for the "PETANELLE" CHALLENGE CUP (Value 20 guineas).

1. This Cup will be offered annually at Cruft's Dog Show, for the best conditioned dog (irrespective of sex or breed), confined to subscribers to Cruft's Show Society.

2. The Dog must be entered in its respective classes of the breed to which it belongs. The same Exhibitor may compete with any number of Exhibits.

3. All Competitors must show their Dogs together at the time appointed for adjudication, when the Judges will make their award by vote. Should the votes be equal, or any difficulty arise in making the award, it shall be decided by the Secretary, or anyone whom he may appoint.

4. The Exhibitor winning the Challenge Cup will be presented with a Medal, or other souvenir of success.

5. A successful Exhibitor will not be eligible to compete again with the same Dog.

6. The winner will be entitled to its custody upon giving solvent security and undertaking to return it upon demand made to him at his last address known to Mr. Cruft. If he fails to return it he will be held responsible for the value.

7. The Cup must be returned in the same condition as when handed to the winner. Should it be damaged, the amount charged by the makers for putting it in order shall be paid to the Society. A Medal will be given to the keeper who shall have the winner in his charge.

### THE INTERNATIONAL BREEDERS' CUPS.

The Competition for these Cups in Breeds where offered for best Dog or Bitch, to be won 3 times by same Exhibitor, who must be the breeder (and who must be a regular Subscriber (S.C.S.)), but not necessarily by same dog.

A Dog that has never Won a Prize is eligible to Compete in the Open, Limit, Special Limit, Junior, Novice, Graduate, Maiden, Selling, Brace and Team Classes.

The Subscription to Cruft's International Dog Show Society is One Guinea per annum.

**KENNEL CLUB RULES.**

COPYRIGHT under Act of 1911. Printed by permission of the Kennel Club for insertion in the Schedule and Catalogue of *Craft's Show* Revised 7th March, 1916.

**PRELIMINARY.**—The Committee of the Kennel Club may, subject to Rule 15, for such time as they think fit, delegate their powers under these Rules wholly, or in part, to any Sub-Committee composed of members of the Kennel Club; or, with the sanction of a General Meeting, to any other body. Certain powers under this Rule have been delegated to the Scottish Kennel Club, and to the Shows Regulation Committee. The Committee of the Kennel Club shall have the power to grant permission for Shows to be held under the Rules of the Kennel Club, or to delegate, and subject to such regulations as they may determine, the Committee of the Kennel Club shall have the power to withdraw or cancel any such permission. An application for a Licence to hold a show under Kennel Club Rules, or otherwise, must be lodged with the Secretary of the Kennel Club, 24, Piccadilly, London, W., at least 30 days previous to the Show, or if the Show be held in Scotland, with the Secretary of the Scottish Kennel Club, 59, George Street, Edinburgh. No Licence shall be granted for a three-day Show except on the undertaking that all dogs are permitted to be removed not later than 6 p.m. on the third day. The fees for Shows held under Kennel Club Rules are as follows:—(a) Payable on application—for one Show, 10s.; for a Compound Licence, 25s.; (b) Payable immediately after the entries close—if the entries exceed 150 and not 250, 10s.; if the entries exceed 250 and not 500, 25s.; for every complete hundred entries over 500, 20s.

**DEFINITIONS.**—The Committee of the Kennel Club means a majority of the Committee present and voting at a properly convened Meeting at which a quorum is present. Delegated Authority—The majority present and voting at a properly convened Meeting of a quorum of a Sub-Committee or other body to whom powers have been delegated by the Committee of the Kennel Club. The singular includes the plural and vice versa. He and Dog include both sexes. A Show means a dog Show, including any exhibition of dogs for competition or awards to which the public are admitted by fee or otherwise. Recognised Shows are those held under Kennel Club Rules, or otherwise by permission of the Committee of the Kennel Club or delegated authority; those held under sanction of an authority abroad recognised by the Kennel Club; all Hound Shows held under an authority recognised by the Kennel Club. Unrecognised Shows are all other Shows: exhibits at the same thereupon become disqualified for entry at any Shows held under permission of the Committee of the Kennel Club or delegated authority. A Hound Show is a Show consisting exclusively of all or any of the following: Foxhounds, Stag-hounds, Otterhounds, Bloodhounds, Harriers, Basset Hounds, and Beagles. An Open Class is one in which all dogs of any breed or variety of breed therein provided for can compete. A Novice Class is one in which no dog can compete which has won a First Prize in any Class other than Puppy, Maiden, Local, Members' or District, or a Challenge Certificate at a Show held under Kennel Club Rules (*vide* Kennel Club Rule 4). A Maiden Class is one for dogs who have never won a prize in any Class at Shows held under Kennel Club Rules (*vide* Kennel Club Rule 4). The words "Novice" and "Maiden" must not be used as the same or part of the name in connection with any other Classes other than those defined above, but they may be used in connection with Local and Members' Classes. (Dogs which have won the title of Champion under American Kennel Club Rules are not eligible for entry in a Novice or Maiden Class at a Show under Kennel Club Rules. A Local Class is a Class confined to either (a) a County; or (b) to a radius not exceeding 20 miles as the crow flies from the main entrance of a Show. A Puppy—a Puppy for the purposes of exhibition is a Dog of six and under twelve months of age, (dating from and inclusive of the date of its birth. A Puppy Class is a Puppy Class is one for Dogs of six and under twelve months of age on the first day of the Show (Puppies over three and under six months of age are ineligible for exhibition (see definition of a Puppy). A Litter—a Litter consists of one or more Puppies born at the same parturition. A Litter Class is one for two or more Puppies of one and the same litter under three months of age on the first day of the Show. Not more than one entry can be made from one litter in the same Class. The Breeder is (i) the owner of a bitch at the time of whelping, or (2) the person to whom it is lent or leased, for breeding purposes, provided prior to the whelping he has lodged a declaration of the lending or leasing, signed by him and the owner of the bitch, with the Secretary of the Kennel Club. (Fee, in the latter case, 5s.) A Compound Licence is one issued for a series of Shows not exceeding four, all to be held within twelve months from the date of the first of the series. A Prize.—A Money Prize or Prize of any description won in a Class, or Special Prize or Challenge Certificate, is included in this definition.

1. **REGISTRATION OF DOGS, NAMES, PEDIGREES, ETC.**—The following registrations must be made at the Kennel Club on forms supplied for the purpose, and in accordance with the directions thereon (see Appendix III, and Official Form):—(a) The name, sex, of a dog prior to exhibition, whether for competition or not (Fee, 2s. 6d.); (b) Any change of the name of such a dog prior to exhibition under its new name (Fee, 10s.); (c) The last transfer of ownership of a registered dog since it was last exhibited, prior to exhibition by its new owner (Fee, 5s.); (d) Rectification of any mistake in a previous registration (Fee, 2s. 6d.) [NOTE.—Unless it can be proved to the satisfaction of the Committee of the Kennel Club that fraud has been committed, or that a bona-fide mistake or misrepresentation has been made, no re-registration of a dog can be allowed as regards breeds or varieties; (e) Prefix or Affix by an individual for exhibition for breeding purposes (Fee, 10s. per annum); (f) A Prefix or Affix may be registered by an individual or partnership (Initial Fee, 15s.; Maintenance Fee, 5s. per annum); (g) Hounds exhibited from a Pack or Cry of Beagles must first be registered at the Kennel Club (see 2s. 6d.), and the name of their Pack or owner must be given as part of the registered name, for which there will be no charge. A shilling enquiry fee will be charged for information as to whether any dog is registered or otherwise. The Committee of the Kennel Club may decline an application for any registration or cancel any registration already made. Dogs are exempt from registration in the following cases:—(1) Dogs exhibited exclusively in Classes specially exempted by the Committee of the Kennel Club or Delegated Authority; (2) Classes for dogs owned by children under sixteen years of age; (3) Exemption Shows, i.e., small Shows held in conjunction with Agricultural and Horticultural Shows, Fetes, and the like; (4) Puppies exhibited exclusively in Litter Classes; (5) Foxhounds, Stag-hounds, and Otterhounds belonging to recognised Packs, and also Harriers, Beagles and Basset Hounds belonging to Packs entered in the Stud Books of the Association of Masters of Harriers and Beagles, and the Masters of Basset Hounds; (6) Foxhounds, Stag-hounds, Otterhounds, Bloodhounds, Harriers, Basset Hounds and Beagles when exhibited at a Hound Show held under an authority recognised by the Kennel Club; (7) Greyhounds already registered in the name of the Exhibitor under the National Coursing Club Rules; (8) Dogs in Special Classes sanctioned by the Committee.

2. **NAMES, PREFIXES AND AFFIXES.**—A name which has become eligible for entry in the Stud Book cannot be again registered in the same breed. A name once registered cannot again be registered in the same breed for ten years after the 1st January following the last registration, except that—if a dog has been registered, but dies before it has been exhibited or bred from, or before it has been entered in the Stud Book, the owner may cancel the name, and the same shall be deemed to have been never registered (Fee, 5s.). A Prefix or Affix shall constitute part of a name. A distinguishing letter or number either in figures or words shall not be used as a prefix or affix. On a change of name of a prize winner the old name, as well as the new, must be given when the dog is entered for exhibition until the new name has been published in *The Kennel Gazette*. A name of a dog which has once become eligible for entry in the Stud Book cannot be changed. The name of a dog imported from the United States of America or its possessions cannot be changed.

3. **ENTRIES FOR EXHIBITION.**—Entries for a Show must close the latest five clear days before the Show opens, and the day fixed may not be altered. In case of violation of this Rule the Secretary or Manager, or both, shall be held responsible and may be dealt with under Rule 17. A dog, when entered for a Show, must be solely and unconditionally the property of the exhibitor. A dog, however, may be sold with its engagements, and exhibited in its new owner's name subject to the transfer being registered previous to the Show, with a declaration that the new owner undertakes to abide by the rules and conditions on the original entry form of the Show. Forms and Official Entry Forms must be filled up for the exhibit of each person. All Entry Forms must be signed by the Exhibitor, or his authorised agent, in accordance with the provisions specified thereon. No official may fill up any Entry Form except his own, or alter any Entry Form after the entry has been made. A Show Committee may reserve the right to refuse any entry. Puppies may be removed at the close of the Show on the first day or on any subsequent day within half-an-hour prior to the opening or subsequent to the closing of the Show. An order for this purpose must be obtained from the Secretary on the first day of the Show.

4. **ESTIMATING NUMBER OF PRIZES WON.**—All wins previous to the midnight preceding the day specified in the Schedule for closing entries shall be counted when entering for any class. Equal awards shall count as a win for each dog so placed.

5. **WITHDRAWAL FROM COMPETITION.**—Once in a Show a dog may not be withdrawn from competition without the written consent of the Show Committee or Secretary, except when the Judge announced in the Schedule is changed, in which case only, the dog may be withdrawn before the commencement of the judging of the breed or variety of the breed, and may be removed from the Show by the owner or his accredited agent.

6. **WEIGHING OF DOGS.**—Every dog entered in a class limited by weight must be weighed in the presence of the Judge, or of a Steward, or other official delegated by the Judge, immediately before competition in any such class and in every subsequent class in which there is a change in the weight limit.

6A. **JUDGE'S DECISION.**—A Judge's decision shall be final except in a case of fraud or misrepresentation or where a mistake has been made *bona-fide* by the Judge. Subject to these exceptions, his decision shall be deemed final at the termination of his judging the class. A Judge shall be empowered to withhold a Special Prize or Challenge Certificate, if in his opinion there is lack of sufficient merit, but he must mark his judging slips that the award has been so withheld. When a Judge withholds a Third Prize for want of merit, the Reserve Award must also be withheld. Subject to Rule XIII, the Judge is not entitled to withhold a prize for any other reason, but he must not withhold any prize in Sweepstake Classes. Any alteration made by a Judge must be intimated by him, and where such alteration is made after the slips are handed in, they must bear the time and date of making such alteration, and must be signed upon his judging slip, or slips, letters, or other document.

7. **CHAMPIONSHIP SHOWS AND TITLE.**—A Championship Show is one at which the Kennel Club permits competition for Challenge Certificates. The title of "Champion" shall attach to a dog winning three Challenge Certificates under three different Judges, except in the case of Pointers, Setters, Sporting Spaniels, and Retrievers born after the 1st June, 1909, in which breeds it shall be neces-

(d) Any Entry Forms called for by the Secretary of the Kennel Club upon demand; (e) Any List of Suspended Persons, sent by the Secretary of the Kennel Club, must be returned immediately after the close of the Show per Registered Post; (f) Any other documents and any information in connection with any appeal or complaint must be forwarded to the Secretary of the Kennel Club, when requested by him.

11. FRAUDULENT OR DISCREDITABLE CONDUCT AT SHOWS TO BE REPORTED.—The Executive of a Show must immediately report to the Committee of the Kennel Club any case of alleged fraudulent or discreditably conduct at or in connection with the Show which may come under its notice, and at the same time forward to the Secretary of the Kennel Club all documents or information in connection therewith which may be in its possession or power. Where alleged fraudulent or discreditably conduct takes place at a Show in Scotland, the Executive of the Show must make such report in the first instance to the Committee of the Scottish Kennel Club.

Providing evidence is placed before the Committee of the Kennel Club that undue influence has been exercised by any person or that any improper means have been adopted to obtain, or interfere with, the appointment of a Judge at Shows under Kennel Club Rules, and the Committee of the Kennel Club consider the evidence warrants any enquiry, the Committee of the Kennel Club will call upon the Committees of such Shows to produce all correspondence or evidence in connection with the case, and will on being convinced of malpractice deal with the offenders under Kennel Club Rule 17.

## APPENDIX II.—Regulations as to the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.

A Dog shall be disqualified from winning a prize, or from receiving one, if awarded, at any Show held under Kennel Club Rules, save and except in such cases as are specified hereunder, under the head "Exceptions," if it be proved to the Committee of the Show or the Committee of the Kennel Club, as the case may be:—

1. That any dye, colouring, darkening, bleaching or other matter has been in any way used for the purpose of altering or improving the colour or markings of a dog.
  2. That any preparation, chemical or otherwise, has been used for the purpose of altering or improving the texture of the coat. [NOTE.—The coat may be cleaned by the use of some dry substance such as boracic acid powder used solely for cleansing purposes, but on no account must any of such substance be allowed to remain in the coat at the time of exhibition.]
  3. That any oil, greasy or sticky substance has been used and remains in the coat during time of exhibition.
  4. That any part of a Dog's coat or hair has been cut, clipped, singed, or rasped down by any substance, or that the new or fast coat has been removed by any means except in the following breeds:—Bedlington Terriers, Collie, Fox Terriers (Wire and Smooth), Pomeranians and Rough-coats (if considered the cods), Yorkshire Terriers. [NOTE.—The old or shedding coat and loose hairs may be removed in all breeds. No comb must be used that has a cutting or rasping edge.]
  5. That any cutting, piercing, breaking by force, or any kind of operation or act which destroys tissues of the ears, or alters their natural formation or carriage, or shortens the tail, or alters the natural formation of the Dog, or any part thereof, has been practised, or any other thing has been done calculated in the opinion of the Committee of the Kennel Club to deceive, except in cases of necessary operation certified to the satisfaction of the Committee of the Kennel Club.
  6. That the lining membrane of the mouth has been cut or mutilated in any way.
- EXCEPTIONS.—1.—Shortening the tails of Dogs of the following breeds will not render them liable to disqualification:—Spaniels (except Irish Water), Airedale Terriers, Fox Terriers, Irish Terriers, Sealyham Terriers, Welsh Terriers, Old English Sheepdogs, Poodles, Toy Spaniels, Yorkshire Terriers, Schipperkes, Griffon Bruxellois, and such varieties of Foreign Dogs as the Committee may from time to time determine. 2.—Dewclaws may be removed in any breed.

REGULATIONS.—Regulations with regard to Classes which are eligible for Free Entry in the Kennel Club Stud Book. Regulations which must be observed by the Executive of Shows held under Kennel Club Rules which apply for the right to offer Challenge Certificates.

FORMS.—Registration, Registration Enquiry, Re-registration, Prefix, Cancellation of Name, Change of Name, Show Entry, Stud Book Entry, Transfer, Stud Visit, Loan of Bitch, Produce, Registration of Assumed Name, Registration of Title, and Application to hold a Show.

## DEFINITION OF CLASSES. The word "Dog" includes both Sexes.

OPEN CLASSES.—OPEN TO ALL, no Prize Winner debarred from competing, but subject to the provisions of Kennel Club Rule 8, in regard to classes limited by height or weight.

LIMIT CLASSES.—For Dogs that have not won more than SIX First Prizes at Shows under K.C. Rules in such classes as are eligible for free entry in the Kennel Club Stud Book, or were so eligible previous to January 1st, 1905.

SPECIAL LIMIT CLASSES.—For Dogs that have not won more than One First Prize at Shows under K.C. Rules in such classes as are eligible for free entry in the Kennel Club Stud Book, or were so eligible previous to January 1st, 1905.

GRADUATE CLASSES.—For Dogs that have not won a First Prize of the value of £2 or over at Shows under K.C. Rules in classes confined to their Breeds; wins in Novice, Puppy, Maiden, Junior, Local, District or Selling Classes excepted.

NOVICE CLASSES.—For Dogs that have not won a Challenge Certificate or a First Prize in any Class at Shows under Kennel Club Rules, wins in Maiden, Puppy, Local, Members' and District Classes excepted. (See K.C. Rule 4.)

MAIDEN CLASSES.—For Dogs that have not won any Prize in any Class at a Show under K.C. Rules. (See K.C. Rule 4.) [February 7th, 1917.]

JUNIOR CLASSES.—For Dogs six months old, and under eighteen months old, on DEBUTANTE CLASSES.—For Dogs that have never been exhibited at any Show prior to January 22nd, 1917. [February 7th, 1917.]

PUPPY CLASSES.—For Dogs six months old, and under twelve months old, on SPECIAL PUPPY CLASSES.—For Dogs six months old, and under nine months old, on [the limit named.]

SELLING CLASSES.—For Dogs which are entered to be sold at a price not exceeding BRACE CLASSES.—For two Dogs of any one breed belonging to the same owner, either or both sexes, which must be named at time of entry, and both of which must be entered in their respective Classes.

TEAM CLASSES.—For three or more Dogs of any one breed belonging to the same owner, either or both sexes, which must be named at time of entry, and all of which must be entered in their respective Classes.

LITTER CLASSES.—For two or more Puppies of one and the same litter, under three months old on February 7th, 1917. (See K.C. Definition)

The Prizes in Classes eligible for free entry in the Kennel Club Stud Book were prior to 1st Jan., 1905, as follows:—All Prizes in Open and Limit Classes at Open Shows held under K.C.R. Subsequent to 1st Jan., 1905:—First, Second and Third Prizes in Open and Limit Classes at Championship Shows where Challenge Certificates have been offered for the breeds.
