1.	Working Party Chairman	Following Mr Ford's resignation, it was necessary to appoint a new Chairman. The Working Party appointed Mr Ray to fulfil this role.	All to note
2.	Activities Committee	Following Mrs Pink's term as representative to the Activities Committee coming to an end, it was necessary to appoint a member to serve as the representative for the 2019-2022 period. The Working Party appointed Mr Ray to fulfil this role.	All to note
3.	Activities Health and Welfare Sub-Group	Mrs Pink was re-elected to serve as the representative to the Activities Health and Welfare Sub-Group for the 2019-2022 period. Should Mrs Pink not be able to attend, Dr Richardson could attend in her place.	All to note
4.	Activities Judges Sub- Group	Following Mrs Hardman's wish to step down from representing the Working Party at the Activities Judges Sub-Group, it was necessary to appoint a new representative. The Working Party appointed Mrs DeRizzio to fulfil this role.	All to note
5.	Working Party membership	Dr Richardson and Miss Ruscoe joined the Working Party following the resignation of Mr Ford and Mrs Brocklehurst.	Competitors to note
6.	Closing dates for entries	The Working Party considered concerns that some competitors were 'blocking' the progress of others, particularly those in the Intermediate class, by continuing to compete in a class once they had qualified out of it. However it did not consider that any change to the current regulation, which states that when entering any class, competitors must count all wins up to and including the seventh day before the closing date of entries, was warranted.	Competition organisers to note.
		It did suggest that Club secretaries should be encouraged to consider the closing dates of other competitions when setting their own in order to minimise any issues.	



9.	Amendment to Crufts Rule 16	The Working Party recommended that Rule 16, Once a routine has been performed at the Crufts finals the handler may not repeat it again at future Crufts finals in any form, be amended to allow a routine to be repeated on the condition that five years had passed since it was previously performed. It also clarified that it would be permissible for the same routine to be performed with the same dog as before,	All to note
