



English Toy Terrier (Black & Tan)

Pedigree Breed Health Survey

Forms were received representing 39 living dogs & 0 deceased dogs.

Mortality results

There were no reported deaths for English Toy Terriers (Black & Tan).

Morbidity results

The 39 live English Toy Terriers (Black & Tan) represented 0.09% of total dogs in the survey. The median age of live dogs for the breed was 2 years (Table 2). Of the 39 English Toy Terriers (Black & Tan) which the survey covers, 27 had reported no conditions and 12 reported affected by at least one condition (min = 1 condition(s), max = 3 conditions), giving a total of 16 incidents of conditions.

The gender, neuter status and age of neutering summary statistics for English Toy Terriers (Black & Tan) are shown in Table 3. There were 34 dogs with responses for Body Condition displayed in Table 4.

The median age the dogs were first affected by a condition was 1.5 years (min = 0 years, max= 14 years, Figure 3). The ages for the most common conditions is displayed in Figure 4. Table 5 shows the reported disease conditions for the English Toy Terrier (Black & Tan).

Summary

From the dogs surveyed, most English Toy Terriers (Black & Tan) were not affected by a disease condition (69.23%). There were four most commonly reported disease condition that represented an equal proportion of the live dogs; these were anal gland/sac impaction/blockage, demodex infestation, otitis media and patellar luxation/slipping kneecap. There were no reported causes of death.
