



Eurasier

Pedigree Breed Health Survey

Forms were received representing 47 living dogs & 2 deceased dogs.

Mortality results

A total of 2 deaths were reported, representing 0.04% of all deaths reported in the Pedigree Breed Health survey. The range of longevity for the Eurasiers was 4 years to 7 years. Table 1 shows the causes of death for the breed.

Morbidity results

The 47 live Eurasiers represented 0.11% of total dogs in the survey. The median age of live dogs for the breed was 3 years (Table 2). Of the 47 Eurasiers which the survey covers, 33 had reported no conditions and 14 reported affected by at least one condition (min = 1 condition(s), max = 7 conditions), giving a total of 30 incidents of conditions.

The gender, neuter status and age of neutering summary statistics for Eurasiers are shown in Table 3. There were 32 dogs with responses for Body Condition displayed in Table 4.

The median age the dogs were first affected by a condition was 4 years (min = 0 years, max= 11 years). Table 5 shows the reported disease conditions for the Eurasier.

Summary

From the dogs surveyed, most Eurasiers were not affected by a disease condition (70.21%). The most commonly reported disease condition in live dogs was hypothyroidism/under-active thyroid. There were only two deaths reported, both representing an equal proportion of the reported deaths.
