



German Spitz (Klein)

Pedigree Breed Health Survey

Forms were received representing 23 living dogs & 2 deceased dogs.

Mortality results

A total of 2 deaths were reported, representing 0.04% of all deaths reported in the Pedigree Breed Health survey. The range of longevity for the German Spitz (Klein) was 12 years to 14years. Table 1 shows the causes of death for the breed.

Morbidity results

The 23 live German Spitz (Klein)s represented 0.05% of total dogs in the survey. The median age of live dogs for the breed was 4 years (Table 2). Of the 23 German Spitz (Klein)s which the survey covers, 19 had reported no conditions and 4 reported affected by at least one condition(min = 1 condition(s), max = 2 conditions), giving a total of 6 incidents of conditions.

The gender, neuter status and age of neutering summary statistics for German Spitz (Klein)s are shown in Table 3. There were 14 dogs with responses for Body Condition displayed in Table 4.

The median age the dogs were first affected by a condition was 0 years (min = 0 years, max= 0 years).Table 5 shows the reported disease conditions for the German Spitz (Klein).

Summary

From the dogs surveyed, most German Spitz (Klein) were not affected by a disease condition (82.61%). All six reported disease conditions represented an equal proportion of the live dogs. The two reported causes of death represented an equal proportion of the deaths reported.
