



Hungarian Puli

Pedigree Breed Health Survey

Forms were received representing 13 living dogs & 5 deceased dogs.

Mortality results

A total of 5 deaths were reported, representing 0.09% of all deaths reported in the Pedigree Breed Health survey. The range of longevity for Hungarian Puli was 7 years to 17 years. Table 1 shows the causes of death for the breed.

Morbidity results

The 13 live Hungarian Pulis represented 0.03% of total dogs in the survey. The median age of live dogs for the breed was 5 years (Table 2). Of the 13 Hungarian Pulis which the survey covers, 6 had reported no conditions and 7 reported affected by at least one condition (min = 1 condition(s), max = 2 conditions), giving a total of 9 incidents of conditions.

The gender, neuter status and age of neutering summary statistics for Hungarian Pulis are shown in Table 3. There were 12 dogs with responses for Body Condition displayed in Table 4.

The median age the dogs were first affected by a condition was 3 years (min = 1 years, max= 9 years). Table 5 shows the reported disease conditions for the Hungarian Puli.

Summary

From the dogs surveyed, most Hungarian Pulis were affected by a disease condition (53.85%). The most commonly reported disease condition in live dogs was lipoma. The most commonly reported cause of death was kidney failure.
