



Pyrenean Sheepdog (Long Haired)

Pedigree Breed Health Survey

Forms were received representing 32 living dogs & 0 deceased dogs.

Mortality results

There were no responses for deceased Pyrenean Sheepdogs (Long Haired).

Morbidity results

The 32 live Pyrenean Sheepdogs (Long Haired) represented 0.07% of total dogs in the survey. The median age of live dogs for the breed was 4 years (Table 2). Of the 32 Pyrenean Sheepdogs (Long Haired) which the survey covers, 28 had reported no conditions and 4 reported affected by at least one condition (min = 1 condition(s), max = 4 conditions), giving a total of 9 incidents of conditions.

The gender, neuter status and age of neutering summary statistics for Pyrenean Sheepdogs (Long Haired) are shown in Table 3. There were 22 dogs with responses for Body Condition displayed in Table 4.

The median age the dogs were first affected by a condition was 7 years (min = 0 years, max= 10 years). Table 5 shows reported disease conditions for the Pyrenean Sheepdog (Long Haired).

Summary

From the dogs surveyed, most Pyrenean Sheepdogs (Long Haired) were not affected by a disease condition (87.50 %). The most commonly reported disease condition in live dogs was patellar luxation/slipping kneecap. There were no responses for deceased dogs.
