1.0 Introduction

Prestige Events Qualifiers (PEQs) have been an integral part of the Agility calendar for many years. Kennel Club registered societies have the opportunity to host qualifier heats throughout the year at Premier Shows. A number of qualifier heats have been hosted by registered societies for several years and, as societies have ceased to exist or opted to relinquish their qualifiers, heats have been reallocated. Whilst there have been numerous changes to agility rules and regulations with changes to height classifications and introduction of an intermediate height, reallocation of heats over the years has sought to try to ensure a spread across the country but there are some disparities on regional splits and the quantity of heats often hosted on the same weekend.

In March 2023, an online Agility Survey was released asking for competitor, judges and show organisers to provide feedback on all topics relating to Agility. A summary of feedback is contained in <u>Section 2.0.</u>

In addition to the agility survey, individual reports relating to poor ground conditions, low entry numbers and other issues relating to the running of PEQs were brought to the attention of the Prestige Events Working Party (PEWP). Feedback from competitors and Team GB management highlighted that national and international qualifications and competitions now take place 12 months of the year which did not allow dogs and handlers any time off and relief from competing. This, coupled with the cost of living crisis and the requirement for a competitors to travel up and down the country, accumulating points, to qualify for PEQ Semi/finals in Novice, Crufts Singles, Crufts ABC Agility Stakes and small/mixi pairs has resulted in the PEWP being given approval to analyse the existing qualifier heats, propose changes to address key issues, and to carry out the first ever full review and reallocation of all Prestige Events Qualifiers*.

*NB: The review excludes Championship classes and YKC events. The International Agility Festival Teams has been removed from the agility calendar after The International Agility Festival 2023 due to the lack of support.

2.0 Agility Survey Feedback

The online agility survey is the largest survey conducted to date on the requirements and wishes of the agility community and included, in addition to Prestige Events questions, an overview and breakdown of those completing the survey to ensure commentary was received from a broad spectrum of the agility community.

Number of responses received – **401** individuals.

Of the 401 individuals, the split of competing dogs (first 4 competing dogs if applicable) shows that very few true beginners (Grade 1) responded to the survey with the majority being Grade 7 and Grade 2 (56.7%).

A key summary of the feedback received was presented to PEWP as follows:

- Cost of living crisis and requirement to travel length and breadth of the country for qualifier heats was an issue for some competitors.
- Points accumulators for prestige qualifier heats exacerbated the requirement to travel. *
- Three of each breed to only qualify in ABC events results in a lower standard of dogs at finals as well as being unfair to those with popular breeds who often have to incur greater expenses to enter qualifier heats in order to qualify in the top three of their breed. *
- The Agility season now lasts 12 months. *
- Qualifier heats held on the same weekend for the same heights at different shows encourages chasing of qualifier heats.
- Qualifier heats clashing with other qualifier heats at Championship shows results in some smaller entry numbers for the non-champ show qualifier heats.
- Split heights/grades of qualifier heats on offer i.e.: where a show is predominantly aimed at a specific height and has only one qualifier heat for a completely different height.
- Poor selection of judges at particular shows for PEQs.
- Poor ground conditions.
- Shows moving dates and locations causing clashes with other shows holding similar qualifier heats.
- Poor standard of, or unpopular, equipment on offer.
- Show management teams and lack of experience running PEQs.
- Regional coverage of qualifier heats.
- Low numbers of entries in some qualifier heats. (Research of all 2022/23 season prestige qualifier heats highlighted shows/regions of above average entries. Also highlighted shows/regions where entries were considerably below the average i.e.: Cornwall ABC qualifier where 3 dogs ran, Scotland ABC qualifier where 8 dogs ran).

*Points highlighted in red, have already been addressed and agreed to be implemented for the 2024/2025 season.

3.0 Current Prestige Events Qualifier Heats

The PEQs and location have evolved over a long period of time. The number of heats has remained fairly consistent, and the rules are largely unchanged. The current Prestige Events calendar accommodates 231 heats spread across the whole 12 month calendar. The current PEQs, number of heats and general qualification criteria are detailed in <u>Appendix A</u> and existing Prestige Events regulations in <u>Appendix B</u> but are summarised below.

- Crufts Singles Small Agility 11heats
- Crufts Singles Medium Agility 11 heats
- Crufts Singles Intermediate Agility 11 heats
- Crufts Singles Large Agility 11 heats
- Crufts Novice Cup Small Dog Agility Stakes 13 heats
- Crufts Novice Cup Medium Dog Agility Stakes 13 heats
- Crufts Novice Cup Intermediate Dog Agility Stakes 14 heats
- Crufts Novice Cup Large Dog Agility Stakes 15 heats
- Crufts Medium ABC Agility Stakes 10 Heats
- Crufts Intermediate Novice ABC Agility Stakes 9 Heats
- Crufts Large Novice ABC Agility Stakes 10 Heats
- Discover Dogs Small/Mixi Pairs Challenge 8 Heats

A review was also carried out to ascertain the number of dogs that actually competed at all PEQs in 2022/2023. These numbers are readily and publicly accessible from the major show processors that maintain online results of the shows that they process, except for First Place Processing where results are no longer available. These shows were given the average entry numbers for that qualifier heat to allow for analysis of data.

The review covers all PEQs and the numbers of entries are shown in different ways. The first two sets of graphs show the number of entries on a regional basis compared to the total number of entries.

- Horizontal bar charts show the percentage of dogs that competed in that qualifier heat, in that region, compared to the national total. (i.e., In the South East, 25% of the total number of all national ABC agility stakes dogs that competed in 2022/23 ran in this region)
- Vertical bar charts show the average number of dogs per class from that region (Yellow bar) against the national average for that qualifier heat (Green bar).




A key summary of the findings from this analysis is as follows:

- Where shows also hold Champ classes, entries into the correlating Singles and Agility Stakes qualifier heats are above average.
- Where shows hold more than one qualifier heat for the same height, of the same level, entries are generally higher than average.
- For qualifier heats that are held in more remote regions, where the eligible dog numbers are lower (i.e.: Large and Intermediate ABC), entry numbers are considerably lower than the average.
- Most regions have at least one show where entry numbers are significantly greater than the average.

- Some regions have a greater percentage of the total number of qualifier heats available and yet still have lower percentages of entries, showing less support for those qualifier heats in those regions.
- Data showed a potential correlation between low entry numbers and shows where equipment, venue and or judges were less popular.










The review also looked at each qualifier heat to assess the entries on a competition by competition basis. An example for each height is shown below.

- Graphs demonstrate comparative numbers of dogs actually competing (not entries) as publicly available from all show processors (excluding First Place as no longer available).
- Tables split individual classes by regions and provide data comparing total number of dogs run against the national averages and the total number of qualifier heats across each region.

4.0 Changes to Prestige Events Qualifier Heats

Following the PEWP meeting held on Thursday 23rd March 2023 the following changes were proposed and are to be integrated into the event rules. Changes to the rules are highlighted in *bold italics with deletion lined through and greyed out.*

- From 2025 there will be an agility season in which qualifier heats take place. This will be between 1 March until 31 October. Within this period there will be specific timescales for each event (for instance KC Agility Stakes qualifier heats need to finish in July, as the Semi-final from 2025 will be held at The International Agility Festival)
- A set of criteria is to be written which explains how we expect clubs to run their qualifier heats. They will be required to sign up to this. If clubs run their qualifier heats against the criteria, then the PEWP have the authority to remove qualifier heats from these clubs.
- PEQs shouldn't be held on the same day. If they need to be held on the same day, then clubs need to be 200 miles apart from each other based on travel distances between postcodes taken from Google maps.
- The PEWP have said that they would like to review clubs holding qualifier heats every 3 years (this needs to be added to the contract that clubs sign).
- Points accumulators for all events are to be removed and replaced with automatic qualifications from each heat.
- The restriction in ABC to a maximum of 3 breeds is to be scrapped with immediate effect (All 2023 qualifier heats)

A summary table of the reallocated PEQs, number of heats and general qualification criteria are detailed in <u>Appendix E</u>

Event Specifics

Each of the PEQs rules, regulations and formats are to be tailored to address feedback received from the agility questionnaire and to modernise each event, making them relevant to a modern sport and ensure the ability to qualify is open to all.

The Kennel Club Agility Stakes

Generally

- The Quarter and Semi-finals will return to The International Agility Festival in 2025.
- The large set of equipment used at the finals will be required for the Quarter & Semi-finals held at The International Agility Festival.
- The main ring at The International Agility Festival will need to be bigger – at least 45 x 30 metres – to replicate the existing Semi-finals and Finals held at The London International Horse Show.
- There will be 10 qualifier heats for each class, throughout the country, which will be held from 1 March until 31 July.

Small & Medium events

- Top five unqualified dogs from each qualifier heat (50 dogs in total for each event, from the 10 qualifier heats) go through to the Semi-final at The International Agility Festival.
- The top 10 from each Semi-final will qualify for the final at The London International Horse Show at ExCel in December

Large & Intermediate events

- Top five unqualified dogs from each qualifier heat (50 dogs in total for each event, from the 10 qualifier heats) go through to the Quarter-finals at The International Agility Festival.
- Top 20 from each Quarter-final will go through to the Semi-final at The London International Horse Show at ExCel in December.

ABC

- There will be both an Intermediate and a Large ABC competition.
- There will be ten qualifier heats for each competition (ten for each height).
- The top three unqualified dogs from each qualifier heat will go through to Semi-final (30 dogs). The Intermediate and Large ABC will be held as separate Semi-finals at The International Agility Festival.
- The top five from each Semi-final will go through to the final at The London International Horse Show at ExCel in December.
- The ten competitors in the final will be competing on the same course. Heights will be changed, and separate awards will be given.
- From 2023 the breed restriction will be removed.

The Kennel Club Dog Agility Stakes

Held at the London International Horse Show supported by Skinner's

General Rules

The following regulations apply to all Agility stakes qualifying Agility heats and finals.

All events must be judged under the appropriate Kennel Club Regulations H & H(1) in force at the time of the event.

The competition will be held under Kennel Club rules and regulations for agility and any handler entering the competition will be deemed to have agreed to abide by these rules and regulations.

There will be ten heats held at Kennel Club licensed shows throughout the country between 1st March and 31st July.

Qualifier course design should reflect that expected in the International Arena at The London International Horse Show at ExCel.

Dogs entered in any heats must be eligible for the competition entered and judges retain the right to check the height of any dog or ask to see the height stated in the Kennel Club Agility Record Book.

Once a dog has qualified for The Kennel Club Agility Stakes Final at one height and subsequently changes height, the qualification is removed and the dog will need to re-qualify

at the new height. The next placed dog at the qualifier at which the withdrawn dog qualified will be invited to the Quarter-Final / Semi-Final. If a height change occurs after the Quarter-Final / Semi-Final, the next placed dog from the Quarter-Final / Semi-Final will be invited to the Semi-Final / Final at The London International Horse Show.

The handler that qualifies a dog for the Quarter-Final / Semi-Final / Final will be the handler that competes, handler substitutions are not allowed.

Dogs cannot compete in more than one competition at The Kennel Club Agility Stakes Finals. If a dog qualifies for more than one Quarter-Final or Semi-Final the first successful qualification will take precedence and the dog will be withdrawn from any further Quarter/Semi-Finals and replaced by a reserve.

Once a dog has qualified for The Kennel Club Agility Stakes Final, or as a reserve the handler is deemed to have accepted an offer to compete at The Kennel Club Agility Stakes final, it invalidates any reserve places in any other competition. If the first invitation to compete is declined it invalidates any reserve places in any other competition.

All winners of The Kennel Club Agility Stakes Finals will be invited to compete in the following year's Quarter-Final or Semi-Final without qualifying through the usual procedure via heats.

Note for show societies: All results from these heats **must** be sent to the Working Dog Activities Team at the Kennel Club within 14 days of the show date.

(These rules will be amended if any changes are made to Kennel Club Agility Regulations during the course of the competition year).

The Kennel Club Small Dog Agility Stakes

Eligibility

Qualifying heats will be scheduled as a standard combined class for grades 5 to 7. Those dogs eligible to compete in competition for Small Dog Agility Stakes are those measuring 350mm or under at the withers.

Qualifying

The first five previously unqualified placed dogs from each heat will go forward to the Semifinal to be held at The Kennel Club International Agility Festival. The first ten dogs from this Semi-final will qualify for the Kennel Club Small Dog Agility Stakes Final held at The London International Horse Show at ExCel in December.

Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat. Competitors may qualify more than one dog for the Semi-final, however only the competitor's highest placed dog at the Semi-final will qualify for The Kennel Club Small Dog Agility Stakes Final.

Once a dog has qualified for the Semi-final, further heats may be entered for competition although any placings in these further heats will not affect the dog's eligibility for the Semi-final.

If a qualified handler or dog is unable/unfit to attend the semi-final, the reserve will be the next placed dog at the qualifier at which the withdrawn dog qualified. If a qualified handler or dog is unable/unfit to attend the final, the reserve will be the next placed dog from the semi-final.

Please note that there will be an entry charge for the Semi-Final at The Kennel Club International Agility Festival and for the Final at The London International Horse Show at ExCel. Car parking won't be provided by The Kennel Club at ExCel in December.

The Kennel Club Medium Dog Agility Stakes

Eligibility

Qualifying heats will be scheduled as a standard combined class for grades 5 to 7. Those dogs eligible to compete in competition for Medium Dog Agility Stakes are those measuring over 350mm and those measuring 430mm or under at the withers.

Qualifying

The first five previously unqualified placed dogs from each heat will go forward to the Semifinal to be held at The Kennel Club International Agility Festival. The first ten dogs from this Semi-final will qualify for the Kennel Club Medium Dog Agility Stakes Final held at The London International Horse Show at ExCel in December. Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat. Competitors may qualify more than one dog for the Semi-final, however only the competitor's highest placed dog at the Semi-final will qualify for The Kennel Club Medium Dog Agility Stakes Final.

Once a dog has qualified for the Semi-final, further heats may be entered for competition although any placings in these further heats will not affect the dog's eligibility for the Semi-final.

If a qualified handler or dog is unable/unfit to attend the semi-final, the reserve will be the next placed dog at the qualifier at which the withdrawn dog qualified. If a qualified handler or dog is unable/unfit to attend the final, the reserve will be the next placed dog from the semi-final.

Please note that there will be an entry charge for the Semi-Final at The Kennel Club International Agility Festival and for the Final at The London International Horse Show at ExCel. Car parking won't be provided by The Kennel Club at ExCel in December.

The Kennel Club Intermediate Dog Agility Stakes

Eligibility

Qualifying heats will be scheduled as a standard combined class for grades 5 to 7. Those dogs eligible to compete in Intermediate Dog Agility competitions are those measuring over 430mm and measuring 500mm or under at the withers.

Qualifying

The first five previously unqualified placed dogs from each heat will go forward to the Quarterfinals to be held at The Kennel Club International Agility Festival.

The first twenty dogs from this quarter-final will compete in a Semi-final held at The London International Horse Show at Excel in December. The top ten highest placed dogs in the Semi-final will qualify for The Kennel Club Intermediate Dog Agility Stakes evening Final at The London International Horse Show.

Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat. Competitors may qualify more than one dog for the Quarter-finals. However, only the competitor's highest placed dog at the Quarter-finals will qualify for the Semi-final.

Once a dog has qualified for the Quarter-final, further heats may be entered for competition although any placings in these further heats will not affect the dog's eligibility for the Quarter-final.

If a qualified handler or dog is unable/unfit to attend the quarter-final, the reserve will be the next placed dog at the qualifier at which the withdrawn dog qualified. If a qualified handler or dog is unable/unfit to attend the semi-final, the reserve will be the next placed dog from the Quarter-final.

Please note that there will be an entry charge for the Quarter-Final at The Kennel Club International Agility Festival and for the Semi-Final / Final at The London International Horse Show at ExCel. Car parking won't be provided by The Kennel Club at ExCel in December.

The Kennel Club Large Dog Agility Stakes

Eligibility

Qualifying heats will be scheduled as a standard combined class for grades 5 to 7. Those dogs eligible to compete in competition for Large dogs are those measuring over 500mm at the withers.

Qualifying

The first five previously unqualified placed dogs from each heat will go forward to the Quarterfinals to be held at The Kennel Club International Agility Festival. If the heat is split, then three dogs will be taken from each part.

The first twenty dogs from this Quarter-final will compete in a Semi-final held at The London International Horse Show at Excel in December. The top ten highest placed dogs in the Semi-final will qualify for The Kennel Club Large Dog Agility Stakes evening Final at The London International Horse Show.

Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat. Competitors may qualify more than one dog for the Quarter-finals. However, only the competitor's highest placed dog at the Quarter-finals will qualify for the Semi-final.

Once a dog has qualified for the Quarter-final, further heats may be entered for competition although any placings in these further heats will not affect the dog's eligibility for the Quarter-final.

If a qualified handler or dog is unable/unfit to attend the quarter-final, the reserve will be the next placed dog at the qualifier at which the withdrawn dog qualified. If a qualified handler or dog is unable/unfit to attend the Semi-final, the reserve will be the next placed dog from the Quarter-final.

Please note that there will be an entry charge for the Quarter-Final at The Kennel Club International Agility Festival and for the Semi-Final / Final at The London International Horse Show at ExCel. Car parking won't be provided by The Kennel Club at ExCel in December.

The Kennel Club Intermediate and Large Dog ABC Agility Stakes

Eligibility

Qualifying heats will be scheduled as a special combined class for grades 5 to 7 in both intermediate and large dog heights. This competition is a special agility competition open to all intermediate dogs and large dogs excluding Border Collies, Working Sheepdogs and any of their crosses. Any concerns regarding a dog's eligibility should be recorded in the Incident Book and reported to The Kennel Club.

Those dogs eligible to compete in competition for Intermediate are those measuring over 430mm and measuring 500mm or under at the withers and Large dogs are those measuring over 500mm at the withers.

Qualifying

The first three previously unqualified intermediate placed dogs and the first three previously unqualified large placed dogs from each heat will go forward to the Semi-final to be held at The Kennel Club International Agility Festival.

The first five intermediate and first five large dogs from this Semi-final will qualify for the Final held at The London International Horse Show at Excel in December. There will be no restriction as to the number of each breed that may qualify for the Final.

The ten competitors in the final will be competing on the same course. Heights will be changed, and separate awards will be given.

Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat. Competitors may qualify more than one dog for the Semi-final, however only the competitor's highest placed dog at the Semi-final will qualify for The Kennel Club Intermediate ABC and Large ABC Dog Agility Stakes Final.

Once a dog has qualified for the Semi-final, further heats may be entered for competition although any placings in these further heats will not affect the dog's eligibility for the Semi-final.

If a qualified handler or dog is unable/unfit to attend the semi-final, the reserve will be the next placed dog at the qualifier at which the withdrawn dog qualified. If a qualified handler or dog is unable/unfit to attend the final, the reserve will be the next placed dog from the semi-final.

Please note that there will be an entry charge for the Semi-Final at The Kennel Club International Agility Festival and for the Final at The London International Horse Show at ExCel. Car parking won't be provided by The Kennel Club at ExCel in December.

Crufts

Prestige Events confirmed that British Open and Team events would not return to Crufts as the programme does not have the time due to the addition of Intermediate finals at the event.

Crufts Singles

- From 2025 the points based system will be removed. Highest places previously unqualified dogs will automatically win onto the final. Results will work on a roll down basis to find unqualified dogs to invite to the final at Crufts. There will be ten dogs in each height (S/M/I/L) invited to the final.
- There will be ten qualifier heats across the country between 1 March and 31 October.
- Each qualifier heat will consist of two rounds (1 agility, and 1 jumping round).
- Each round will be run as combined 6-7 class.
- Both rounds must take place on the same day of the show.
- Both rounds will have a random running order produced in advance.
- The winner will be the dog and handler from the combined results from both rounds. The winner will be the dog and handler with the fastest time, with the least number of faults.

Crufts Medium ABC/Intermediate ABC/Large ABC

- All events will be run as a combined 1-7 class.
- Course design should be set at Grade 5 level.
- Novice will be removed from the event titles.
- There will be ten heats across the country between 1 March and 31 October.
- The top two unqualified dogs will go through to the Semi-final (20 dogs for each event). The Semi-final will be held alongside at The London International Horse Show at ExCel in December.
- The top ten from each Semi-final will qualify for the final at Crufts.

Crufts Agility

General Rules

The following regulations apply to all qualifying agility heats and finals.

The competition will be held under Kennel Club rules and regulations for agility and any handler entering the competition will be deemed to have agreed to abide by these rules and regulations.

There will be ten heats for each height, held at Kennel Club licensed shows throughout the country between 1st March and 31st October.

All heats must take place at Kennel Club licensed shows and the class name in the schedule should replicate exactly the name of the competition as stated in these rules and regulations.

Course design should reflect that expected in the main Crufts arena.

Dogs entered in any heats must be eligible for the competition entered. Judges have the right to check the dog's Kennel Club Agility Record Book to ensure the dog is running in the correct height category.

The handler that qualifies a dog in the heats will be the handler that competes in the Crufts Final, handler substitutions are not allowed.

If a qualified handler or dog is unable/unfit to attend the final, the reserve will be the next placed dog at the qualifier at which the withdrawn dog qualified.

An entry fee will be charged for each dog at Crufts.

Note for show societies: All results from these heats **must** be sent to the Working Dog Activities Team at the Kennel Club within 14 days of the show date

(These rules will be amended if any changes are made to Kennel Club Agility Regulations during the course of the competition year).

Crufts Singles

Eligibility

Qualifying heats will be scheduled as a standard combined class for grades 6 and 7. There will be a separate qualifying competition for each height category small, medium, intermediate and large.

Qualifying

There will be ten qualifying heats throughout the year. The first placed unqualified dog in each heat will automatically qualify and be invited to compete in the Crufts Singles Finals at Crufts for each height category small, medium, intermediate and large.

The qualifying heats will consist of two rounds, one jumping and one agility. Both rounds must take place on the same day at the show. The winning partnership will be those with the least combined faults in the fasted combined time calculated over the two rounds. If there is equality of faults and time, the agility round faults followed by time will take precedence.

If a dog has already qualified, then results from that qualifier will roll down to find the next unqualified dog to invite to the final at Crufts.

Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat. Competitors may qualify more than one dog for the final.

If a qualified handler or dog is unable/unfit to attend the final, the reserves will be the next placed dog at the qualifier at which the withdrawn dog qualified.

Please note that there will be an entry charge for the Final at Crufts and car parking won't be provided by The Kennel Club.

Crufts Medium, Intermediate and Large Dog ABC Agility (Special)

Eligibility

Qualifying heats will be scheduled as a special combined class for grades 1 to 7 in medium. intermediate and large dog heights.

Courses will be set at Grade 5 level.

This competition is a special agility competition open to all intermediate dogs and large dogs excluding Border Collies, Working Sheepdogs and any of their crosses. Any concerns regarding a dog's eligibility should be recorded in the Incident Book and reported to The Kennel Club.

Those dogs eligible to compete in competition for in medium dog competition are those measuring over 350mm and those measuring 430mm or under at the withers, Intermediate are those measuring over 430mm and measuring 500mm or under at the withers and Large dogs are those measuring over 500mm at the withers.

Qualifying

There will be ten qualifying heats throughout the year for each height, medium, intermediate and large. The first two unqualified placed dogs in each heat at each height will automatically qualify for the Semi-final to be held at The London International Horse Show at ExCel in December.

The Semi-final will consist of one round of agility competition and one round of jumping competition. The winning partnership will be those with the least combined faults in the fasted combined time calculated over the two rounds of the semi-final. If there is equality of faults and time, the agility round faults followed by time will take precedence.

The first ten placed dogs in each height at the Semi-final will be invited to compete in the finals to be held at Crufts Dog Show, NEC Birmingham the following March.

The final will consist of one round of jumping and one round of agility competition. The winning partnership will be those with the least combined faults in the fasted combined time calculated over the two rounds of the final. If there is equality of faults and time, the agility round faults followed by time will take precedence.

Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heats and Semi-Final but can only qualify one dog for the final. The highest placed dog will qualify for the final and places will roll down to the next placed eligible dog.

There will be no restriction on the number of dogs from each breed that are eligible to compete in the final.

If a qualified handler or dog is unable/unfit to attend the Semi-final, the reserve will be the next placed dog at the qualifier at which the withdrawn dog qualified. If a qualified handler or dog is unable/unfit to attend the Final, the reserve will be the next placed dog from the Semi-final.

Please note that there will be an entry charge for the Semi-Final at The London International Horse Show at ExCel and at the Finals at Crufts. Car parking won't be provided by The Kennel Club.

Crufts Novice Cup

- From 2025, the Semi-final will move from The International Agility Festival and will be held at The London International Horse Show at Excel in December.
- The final will still take place at Crufts.
- Dogs will need to be either grade 3, 4 or 5 at the time of qualifying.
- Due to the potential timescales between qualifying at a heat, the Semifinal in December and the final in March, it is appreciated that some dogs will progress through the grades and may not be in Grades 3, 4 or 5 at the time of the Semi-final or final. Dogs have progressed to Grades 6 or 7 at the time of the Semi-final or final **are** eligible to compete in those finals.
- Any dog that has qualified for the Semi-final or final and subsequently progresses out of Grades 3, 4 and 5 and wins a Championship Agility Certificate (is eligible to compete in the Championship Agility Finals at Crufts) will be withdrawn from the Novice Cup and the next placed dog from the qualifier of the dog removed will be invited to the Semi-final / final.
- There will be ten qualifier heats across the country between 1st March and 31st October.
- The top two in each height (S/M/I/L) (20 in each height), will be invited to the Semi-final in December. The top 8 in each height will qualify for the final at Crufts.

Crufts Novice Cup Dog Agility

Competition Rules

The competition will be held under Kennel Club rules and regulations for Agility and any handler entering the competition will be deemed to have agreed to abide by these rules and regulations. Standard rules will apply and all equipment used shall be of a standard size for that height category. There will be ten heats for each height, held at Kennel Club licensed shows throughout the country between 1st March and 31st October. Course design should reflect that expected in the finals for the competition.

Eligibility

Qualifying heats will be scheduled as a standard combined agility class for grades 3 to 5. There will be a separate qualifying competition for each height category small, medium, intermediate and large.

Any dog that has qualified for the Semi-final or final and subsequently progresses out of Grades 5 is still eligible to compete in the Semi-final / final.

Any dog having qualified for the Semi-final or Final that wins a Championship Agility Certificate (i.e. is eligible to compete in the Championship Agility Finals at Crufts) immediately becomes ineligible to compete in the Novice Cup Semi-final / Final and shall be withdrawn. The next placed dog from the qualifier of the withdrawn dog will be invited to the Semi-final / Final (assuming they are also still eligible).

Qualifying

There will be ten qualifying heats throughout the year. The first two unqualified placed dogs in each heat will automatically qualify for the semi-final to be held at The London International Horse Show at ExCel in December.

Once a dog has qualified for the Semi-final, further heats may be entered for competition although any placings in these heats will not affect the dog's eligibility for the Semi-final.

Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat. Competitors may qualify more than one dog for the Semi-final, however only the competitor's highest placed dog at the Semi-final will qualify for the Crufts Final.

If a qualified handler or dog is unable/unfit to attend the Semi-final, the reserve will be the next placed dog at the qualifier at which the withdrawn dog qualified. If a qualified handler or dog is unable/unfit to attend the Final, the reserve will be the next placed dog from the Semi-final.

The top eight dogs in each height category small, medium, intermediate and large from the Semi-final round of the Kennel Club Novice Cup will be invited to compete in the Final at Crufts Dog Show, NEC Birmingham the following March.

Please note that there will be an entry charge for the Semi-Final at The London International Horse Show at ExCel and at the Finals at Crufts. Car parking won't be provided by The Kennel Club.

The Kennel Club Small / Mixi Pairs Challenge (Special)

- All events will be run as a combined 1-7 class.
- Course design should be set at Grade 3-5 level.
- There will be 10 heats across the country between 1 March and 31 October.
- The first placed unqualified pair will go straight through to the Final (10 pairs). The Final will be held at The London International Horse Show at Excel in December.

The Kennel Club Small / Mixi Pairs Jumping Challenge (Special)

Competition Rules

The competition is open to small dogs, partnering a medium dog, intermediate dog or a large dog, and heats will be scheduled as a Special combined class for grades 1 to 7.

There must be a minimum of 12 obstacles and a maximum of 15 obstacles for each height and at least one height must have a set of weaves.

This is a relay competition with a baton change taking place either in a box or behind a line at the judges' discretion.

No part of the next dog/handler must be over the start line at the changeover; failure to observe this will incur a penalty of 20 faults. A dropped baton or baton on the floor at any time during the run will incur a penalty of 20 faults.

An elimination will incur a penalty of 100 faults. Once a dog has been eliminated it cannot incur further faults. However, if either member of the pair fail to complete the course correctly or either of the dogs foul the ring the pair will be disqualified.

The competition will involve changes of height of the obstacles being jumped by the medium/intermediate/large dogs during the class. The judge will decide which height of dog to start with and will announce the changes of height when relevant. It is the competitors' responsibility to be available accordingly. The course will be walked by everyone before the beginning of the class.

Eligibility

The competition is open to two dogs with separate handlers. One dog must be a small dog, 350mm or under at the withers, the partner can be a medium dog, over 350mm but 430mm or under at the withers, or an intermediate dog over 430mm and measuring 500mm or under at the withers, or a large dog over 500mm.

Qualifying

There will be 10 qualifying heats throughout the year. The first unqualified placed pair in each heat will automatically qualify for the final to be held at The London International Horse Show at ExCel in December.

Handlers with more than one dog may enter in more than one pair. However, they may only qualify with one dog for the final. No substitute handlers will be allowed in the final.

The final will consist of two rounds of jumping competition. The winners of The Kennel Club Small / Mixi Pairs will be the pair with the least combined faults in the fastest combined time calculated over the two rounds of the final.

If a qualified pair, handler or dog is unable/unfit to attend the final, no substitutes will be allowed. The reserves will be the next placed pair at the qualifier at which the withdrawn pair qualified.

Please note that there will be an entry charge, and car parking won't be provided by The Kennel Club.

5.0 Application process

In August 2023, notification that the PEWP were reviewing the format and allocation of all PEQs was followed up by requesting all interested Registered Societies to submit their interests via an online form.

The online form specifically requested key details of:

- Society name
- Location, postcode and dates of the 2025 shows
- Key personnel involved in the running of the show.
- Equipment supplier to be used.
- Heats wishing to apply for and specifically what heights for each.

The deadline for applications was 4th September 2023. After this date all applications were collated and are summarised in <u>Section 6.0</u>.

Kennel Club Agility Qualifiers From 2025

We would like to announce that The Kennel Club has decided to conduct a review of the allocation of all Kennel Club Agility qualifiers from 2025 onwards. This means that all Kennel Club fully registered agility clubs, whether they already hold qualifiers or not, will need to apply to host KC agility qualifiers from this date as these will be redistributed across the country. This is also an opportunity for clubs who do not currently hold qualifier to apply.

It has also been agreed that an agility season for prestige event qualifiers will be put into place <u>from 1</u> <u>March until 31 October (</u>except for The Kennel Club Agility Stake qualifiers which will be from 1 March until 31 July due to the quarter and semi-finals).



6.0 Returns Analysis

There were a total of 737 applications from 59 registered societies for the 180 heats on offer from across the whole country. The applications covered a total of 27 of the 35 weekends available during the agility calendar season of 1st March to 31st October.

Of the applications, the most applications (192) were received for the Novice Cup qualifier heats where a total of 40 heats were available. The table below shows the number of applications for each competition.



7.0 Criteria and Rationale for shortlisting

Based on the feedback from the competitor Agility Questionnaire and application process, the following points were developed as key drivers for the selection process of the registered societies to hold the limited number of heats on offer.

Key drivers for Decisions

- The number of qualifier heats is considerably reduced for most competitions leaving fewer qualifier heats to split fairly across the regions and clubs (24% fewer qualifier heats).
- Singles classes alongside Championship shows typically showed above average entries –some considerably higher.
- Ensuring regional accessibility to all major qualifier heats without the requirement to travel significant distances throughout the season (Whilst ensuring regions are not over allocated/overlooked).
- Combining complementary qualifier heats at shows where entry numbers are consistently high / well supported.
- Try to maintain 200 miles separation between shows hosting the same PEQs on the same weekend, acknowledging that some qualifier heats of differing grades/dogs (Novice and ABC) have a different attraction to Championship/Singles/Agility Stakes.
- Some shows are not eligible for all qualifier heats due to the agility season (Agility Stakes qualifier heats after 31st July).
- Ensuring a spread of qualifier heats to as many clubs meeting the criteria as possible whilst respecting the number of shows held on each weekend during the agility season.

- Where championship classes only cater for 1 or 2 heights, preference of those heights have been given to those qualifier heats (Axstane Small/Medium and Scunthorpe Intermediate/Large).
- Matrix developed to assess quality of shows based on a similar remit to championship show allocation and additional criteria highlighted as key factors when competitors choose shows to attend and key factors that they see as important for a prestige event – see matrix chart over.

8.0 Recommendations

Based on all the information gathered to date - the questionnaires, previous qualifier regional analysis, PE applications, key drivers for decisions and show matrix, recommendations have been made for all qualifier heats to be allocated for the season commencing March 2025. Due to the reduction in number of heats from 231 to 180 (22% less), reduction in number of weekends available (52 to 32) and number of applications (approx. 4.1 applications for every heat), the PEWP appreciate that decisions made have not been easy ones, but the recommended allocations have been thoroughly reviewed and attempt to address as many of the points and key drivers raised as possible.

Notes for allocation

- The allocation has been based on a completely impartial, non-biased basis, ensuring that as many of the drivers and issues have been addressed.
- Shows highlighted in green are Championship Shows. Several other Championship Shows did not apply for any qualifier heats.
- Several shows applied for qualifier heats at multiple shows and dates. Qualifiers are only awarded to one show/date for each club.
- Clubs in orange have been identified as potential 'Super Shows'. In order to achieve a regional spread in the reduced agility calendar, as well as reducing travel and expenditure for competitors to attend multiple qualifier heats, these shows tend to have considerably higher than average entries within their region. Most are larger championship shows allowing competitors to keep travel and accommodation expenses to a minimum whilst still maximising qualifier opportunities.
- Mapping shows the regional spread of qualifier heats across the country and demonstrates a good spread and access to a good number of qualifier heats for competitors in all regions. See <u>appendix F</u>.

A large number of shows requested qualifier heats in the middle of the season (weeks 19 to 27 – July and August) – equivalent to 42% of all club applications.

9.0 Further work and Reviews

It is important that the quality and standard of all PEs is maintained. Customer feedback is key to this. To obtain feedback, online questionnaires from a broad range of stakeholders will need to be captured. Whilst competitor feedback is important as the end customer, it is also important to gain feedback from show organisers, judges and field officers to ensure a fair and balanced response is received.

The feedback is key in helping the PEWP review the standards and quality expected and signed up to by the shows in the Prestige Events Contract and this working party should therefore be responsible to both setting the assessment criteria as well as the questionnaire and should be responsible for analysing responses as part of ongoing reviews into PEQs throughout the year. All responses will be reviewed at the quarterly PEWP meetings.

An online questionnaire will be compiled and be readily accessible which is to be completed after each heat covering the main points below. It is important to note that whilst open comments are important, compiling these as feedback is difficult and therefore each item will be scored out of 10 with a comment section for individual points to be made.

Feedback to be reviewed after each heat.

- Show pull down list.
- Date calendar selector
- Event Agility Stakes, Singles pull down list.
- Name Although this will be kept confidential, it's important to track responses.
- Area of the country you live in by ALC region so we can review trends in travel to shows.
- Weather is it important as this can have many contributing factors to the feedback received.
- Organisation score 1 to 10 (1 Extremely Poor to 10 Exceptional)
- Ground Conditions score 1 to 10 (1 Extremely Poor to 10 Exceptional)
- Camping and other facilities score 1 to 10 (1 Extremely Poor to 10 Exceptional)
- Equipment supplied score 1 to 10 (1 Extremely Poor to 10 Exceptional)
- Course design relevant to competition and final not aimed at judge bashing or any judging decisions made, purely, was the course design typical of the type expected in the semi/final yes or no.
- Other comments open text box with maximum word count

10.0 Prestige Events Contract

Prestige Events Agility Qualifying Competitions held under Kennel Club Premier Agility Show License

Prestige Events Agility Qualifying Competitions will be held under a Premier Agility licence issued by the Kennel Club and subject to Kennel Club H Regulations. In addition, clubs hosting Prestige Events Agility Qualifying heats need to meet the aims and objectives set out below.

Aims

To ensure the highest possible standards are maintained by clubs hosting the Kennel Club's prestige event qualifiers we have introduced some objectives and conditions for holding such qualifying heats.

Objectives

Venues

To ensure:

- 1. The venue used is suitable for the level of competition.
- 2. The venue and surrounding environment is safe for dogs, handlers, stewards, volunteers and judges.
- 3. There are adequate facilities for exercising dogs.

Ground Conditions

To ensure:

- 1. The ground used is well maintained, level and is of suitable standard for Agility competitions.
- 2. The ground is maintained to and is sufficiently well kept to accommodate all but the most extreme weather conditions.
- 3. The surface used is adequately prepared, for example the grass covering is consistent and cut to an appropriate height, sand surfaces are well

maintained and regularly harrowed to ensure consistency across the competition.

Facilities

To ensure:

- 1. Camping and parking provision meets the needs of the expected entry.
- 2. Camping and parking facilities allow access as close to competition rings as the venue and entry permits.
- 3. Basic facilities include toilets, showers (for events longer than two days/nights) are provided and these facilities are kept clean during the event.
- 4. Roadways are well kept and are sufficient for the level of movement anticipated across the venue site.

Ease of Access

To ensure:

1. Access to the venue is safe and well maintained, ingress and egress does not pose an unnecessary risk and prevents queuing on public highways.

Show Processing & Results

To ensure:

- 1. Online entries are available and that the show processor has a reliable effective system.
- 2. A full online results service is available and accessible, with live data capabilities where possible.

Equipment

To ensure:

- 1. Agility equipment used is up to date, well maintained and conforms to current KC Regulations.
- 3. Where new / improved equipment is being introduced this has been given prior approval by the ALC Equipment Panel.

Judges & Course Design

To ensure:

1. That judges appointed to the heats and qualifying competitions have the appropriate degree of experience.

 The show management are confident that the chosen judge(s) have the capability to / capacity to design and set courses for the correct level for the heat(s) / qualifying competition for which they have been selected.

Show Management

To ensure:

- The show management is of sufficient experience to run the event / heats granted to them, and that the aims and objectives of the agreement with the Kennel Club are being met.
- That any changes to the date of the competition, venue or significant issues relating to the heats and qualifying competitions, or changes to the show management are notified to the Kennel Club immediately. Where dates and or venues are subject to change - approval must be sought from the Kennel Club.

Agreement

On behalf of (Registered Show Society) I / We agree to conform to and abide by the above aims and objectives, as may be amended from time to time, for the following qualifying heats granted by the Kennel Club:

Fees

The Kennel Club, subject to Board approval and confirmation, may impose a levy of £1.00 per dog, per class entered. The Registered Society is obliged to remit the total funds to the Kennel Club within one month of the closing date of the show, together with a summary of the dogs entered for each class where the fee is payable.

This agreement is valid for three Prestige Events calendar agility seasons, commencing March 1st 2025, and may be subject to review earlier, or, before the end date, October 31st 2027, if necessary.

The Kennel Club reserves the right to withdraw any such heats and or qualifying competitions should any or all of the above aims, objectives and conditions are deemed not to have been met by the Registered Society.

The Kennel Club Small Dog Agility Stakes

This competition will be classified as Small Dog combined Grades 5-7 and judged under the Kennel Club Regulations for standard classes

Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat. Competitors may qualify more than one dog for the Semi-final, however only the competitor's highest placed dog at the Semi-final will qualify for The Kennel Club Agility Stakes Grand Final.

Once a dog has qualified for the Semi-final / Final, further heats may be entered for competition although any placings in these further heats will not affect the dog's eligibility for the Semi-final / Finals.

Those dogs eligible to compete in competition for Small Dog Agility are those measuring 350mm or under at the withers.

The first three previously unqualified placed dogs from each heat will go forward to the Semi-final. The first 10 dogs from this Semi-final will qualify for the Final held at The London International Horse Show (subject to the above).

The Kennel Club Medium Dog Agility Stakes

This competition will be classified as Medium Dog combined Grades 5-7 and judged under the Kennel Club Regulations for standard classes.

Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat. Competitors may qualify more than one dog for the Semi-final, however only the competitor's highest placed dog at the Semi-final will qualify for The Kennel Club Agility Stakes Grand Final. Once a dog has qualified for the Semi-final/Final, further heats may be entered for competition although any placings in these further heats will not affect the dog's eligibility for the Semi-final/Final.

The first three previously unqualified placed dogs from each heat will go forward to the Semifinal. The first 10 dogs from this Semi-final will qualify for the Final held at The London International Horse Show (subject to the above).

Those dogs eligible to compete in Medium dog competition are those measuring over 350mm and those measuring 430mm or under at the withers.

The Kennel Club Intermediate Dog Agility Stakes

This competition will be classified as combined Grades 5-7 and judged under the Kennel Club Regulations for standard classes.

Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat. Competitors may qualify more than one dog for the Quarter-finals. However, only the competitor's highest placed dog at the Quarter-finals will qualify for the Semi-final.

Once a dog has qualified for the Quarter-final, further heats may be entered for competition although any placings in these further heats will not affect the dog's eligibility for the Quarter-final/Semi-final.

The first 5 previously unqualified placed dogs from each heat will go forward to the Quarterfinals. If the heat is split then three dogs will be taken from each part. The first 20 dogs from this Quarter-final will qualify for the Semi-final held at The London International Horse Show.

The 20 dogs who qualify for The Kennel Club Intermediate Dog Agility Stakes will compete in a Semi-final held at The London International Horse Show The top 10 highest placed dogs in the Semi-final will qualify for the evening Grand Final held at The London International Horse Show (subject to the above).

Those dogs eligible to compete in Intermediate Dog Agility competitions are those measuring over 430mm and measuring 500mm or under at the withers.

The Kennel Club Large Dog Agility Stakes

This competition will be classified as combined Grades 5-7 and judged under the Kennel Club Regulations for standard classes.

Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat. Competitors may qualify more than one dog for the Quarter-finals. However, only the competitor's highest placed dog at the Quarter-finals will qualify for the Semi-final.

Once a dog has qualified for the Quarter-final, further heats may be entered for competition although any placings in these further heats will not affect the dog's eligibility for the Quarter-finals/Semi-finals.

The first 5 previously unqualified placed dogs from each heat will go forward to the Quarterfinals. If the heat is split then three dogs will be taken from each part. The first 20 dogs from this Quarter-final will qualify for the Semi-final held at The London International Horse Show.

The 20 dogs who qualify for The Kennel Club Large Dog Agility Stakes will compete in the Semi-final held at The London International Horse Show. The top 10 highest placed dogs in

the Semi-final will qualify for the evening Grand Final held at The London International Horse Show (subject to the above).

Those dogs eligible to compete in competition for Large dogs are those measuring over 500mm at the withers.

The Kennel Club Large Dog ABC Agility Stakes

This competition will be classified as combined Grades 5-7 and judged under the Kennel Club Regulations for standard classes.

This competition is a special agility competition open to all dogs excluding Border Collies, Working Sheepdogs and any of their crosses. Any concerns should be recorded in the Incident Book and reported to the Kennel Club.

Those dogs eligible to compete in competition for Large dogs are those measuring over 500mm at the withers.

Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat. Competitors may qualify more than one dog for the Semi-final, however only the competitor's highest placed dog at the Semi-final will qualify for the Grand Final. Once a dog has qualified for the Semi-final/Final, further heats may be entered for competition although any placings in these further heats will not affect the dog's eligibility for the Semi-final/Final.

The first three previously unqualified placed dogs from each heat will go forward to the Semifinal. The first 10 dogs from this Semi-final will qualify for the Final held at The London International Horse Show (subject to the above).

Crufts Qualifiers

Crufts Singles Agility Competition

Qualifying heats will be scheduled as a standard combined class for grades 6 & 7. There will be a separate qualifying competition for each height category (small, medium, intermediate and large) with 11 heats for each height, held at Kennel Club licensed shows throughout the country.

Eligibility

Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat. Competitors may qualify more than one dog for the final.

Qualifying

The first 10 placed dogs in each heat will have the following points awarded:

1st place = 10 points, 2nd place = 9 points etc. down to 10th place = 1 point. Qualifying points will be awarded down to 10th even if the show does not award class places down to 10th. The top 8 dogs from each height with the highest accumulation of points will be invited to compete in the Crufts Singles Agility Finals at Crufts 2025. Please note that there will be an entry charge, and car parking won't be provided by The Kennel Club.

If a qualified handler or dog is unable/unfit to attend the final, reserves will be taken from dog/s with the highest number of points from the heats which have/has not qualified.

Crufts Large Novice ABC Agility Stakes (Special)

Eligibility

This competition is a special agility competition open to all dogs excluding Border Collies, Working Sheepdogs and any of their crosses. In the event of any dispute regarding the parentage of a dog competing in the ABC Agility competition, any concerns should be recorded in the Incident Book and reported to the Kennel Club.

Those dogs eligible to compete in competition for large dogs are those measuring over 50cm at the withers.

Dogs should be eligible to compete at Grade 1 - 5 at the time of qualifying for the Semi-final. Any subsequent wins gained by the dog will not alter its eligibility to compete in the Semi-final or final.

Competition Rules

The competition will be held under Kennel Club rules and regulations for Agility and any handler entering the competition will be deemed to have agreed to abide by these rules and regulations. Standard rules will apply and all equipment used shall be of a standard size for that height category.

The Semi-final will consist of one round of agility competition and one round of jumping competition; the top 8 dogs qualifying for Crufts will be those with the least combined faults in the fastest combined time calculated over the two rounds of the Semi-final. If there is equality of faults and time, the agility round will take precedence.

The final will consist of one round of jumping and one round of agility competition. The winning partnership will be those with the least combined faults in the fasted combined time calculated over the two rounds of the final. If there is equality of faults and time, the agility round will take precedence.

Qualifying

Dogs should be eligible to compete at Grade 1 - 5 at the time of qualifying for the Semi-final. Any subsequent wins gained by the dog will not alter its eligibility to compete in the Semi-final or final.

Competition Rules

The competition will be held under Kennel Club rules and regulations for Agility and any handler entering the competition will be deemed to have agreed to abide by these rules and regulations. Standard rules will apply and all equipment used shall be of a standard size for that height category.

The Semi-final will consist of one round of agility competition and one round of jumping competition; the top 8 dogs qualifying for Crufts will be those with the least combined faults in

Crufts Medium ABC Agility Stakes (Special)

Eligibility

This competition is a special agility competition open to all dogs excluding Border Collies, Working Sheepdogs and any of their crosses. In the event of any dispute regarding the parentage of a dog competing in the ABC Agility competition, any concerns should be recorded in the Incident Book and reported to the Kennel Club.

Those dogs eligible to compete in Medium dog competition are those measuring over 35cm and those measuring 43cm or under at the withers and eligible to compete in combined Grades 1 to 7 for Medium dogs.

Competition Rules

The competition will be held under Kennel Club rules and regulations for Agility and any handler entering the competition will be deemed to have agreed to abide by these rules and regulations. Standard rules will apply and all equipment used shall be of a standard size for that height category.

The Semi-final will consist of one round of agility competition and one round of jumping competition; the top 8 dogs qualifying for Crufts will be those with the least combined faults in the fastest combined time calculated over the two rounds of the Semi-final. If there is equality of faults and time, the agility round will take precedence.

The final will consist of one round of jumping and one round of agility competition. The winning partnership will be those with the least combined faults in the fasted combined time calculated over the two rounds of the final. If there is equality of faults and time, the agility round will take precedence.

Qualifying

There will be 10 qualifying shows throughout the year. The first 10 placed dogs in each heat will have the following points awarded:

1st place = 10 points, 2nd place = 9 points etc. down to 10th place = 1 point. Qualifying points will be awarded down to 10th even if the show does not award class places down to 10th.

If a qualified handler or dog is unable/unfit to attend the final, reserves will be taken from dog/s with the highest number of points from the heats which have/has not qualified.

The top fifteen dogs, with the most points, will be invited to a Semi-final at Discover Dogs 2024 which is being held alongside The London International Horse Show at London, ExCel in December. There will be a charge per dog. Car parking will not be provided by The Kennel Club.

The first eight highest placed dogs at the Semi-final will be invited to compete in the finals to be

held at Crufts Dog Show, NEC Birmingham in March 2025. Please note that there will be an entry charge, and car parking won't be provided by The Kennel Club.

Crufts Novice Cup Dog Agility Stakes

This is a combined 3-5 class. Dogs should be eligible to enter a Grade 3, 4 or 5 class at the time of qualifying for the Semi-final. Any subsequent wins gained by the dog will not alter its eligibility to compete in the Semi-final or Final.

There will be up to 14 separate heats for large, intermediate, medium and small height dogs at Kennel Club licensed shows throughout the country, plus an additional heat at the International Agility Festival.

Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat. Competitors may qualify more than one dog for the Semi-final at the International Agility Festival, however only the competitor's highest placed dog at the Semi-final will qualify for the Crufts Grand Final.

Once a dog has qualified for the Semi-final, further heats may be entered for competition although any placings in these heats will not affect the dog's eligibility for the Semi-final.

Qualifying

The first 2 previously unqualified dogs from each heat will go forward to the Semi-final at the Kennel Club International Agility Festival. If the heat is split then 2 dogs will be taken from each part. There will also be a Novice Cup heat at the Kennel Club International Agility Festival, where the first 5 previously unqualified placed dogs (from each part if the class is split) will also go forward to the Semi-final.

If a competitor does not take up the invitation to compete in the Semi-final, the invitation will be rolled down to the next applicable dog from the relevant heat. No reserves will be invited after the running orders for the Semi-final have been generated.

The top 6 large dogs, 6 intermediate, 6 medium dogs and 6 small dogs from the Semi-final round of the Kennel Club Novice Cup will be invited to compete in the Final at Crufts 2025. Please note that there will be an entry charge, and car parking won't be provided by The Kennel Club.

Discover Dogs Small / Mixi Pairs Challenge (Special)

This is a competition consisting of eight heats of jumping. The competition is open to small dogs, partnering a medium dog, intermediate dog or a large dog, and heats will be scheduled as a Special combined class for grades 1 to 7.

Eligibility

The competition is open to two dogs with separate handlers. One dog must be a small dog, 35cm or under at the withers, the partner can be a medium dog, over 35cm but 43cm or under at the withers, or an intermediate dog over 43cm and measuring 50cm or under at the withers, or a large dog over 50cm.

Handlers with more than one dog may enter in more than one pair. However, they may only qualify a maximum of two dogs for the final. No substitute handlers will be allowed in the final.

Should a qualified dog or handler within a pair be unable/unfit to enter the final that pair will not be able to compete. Their place in the final will be offered to the next available pair with the highest points who have not qualified.

Competition Rules

The competition will be held under Kennel Club rules and regulations for Agility and any handler entering the competition will be deemed to have agreed to abide by these rules and

regulations. Standard rules will apply and all equipment used shall be of a standard size for that height category.

This is a relay competition with a baton change taking place either in a box or behind a line at the judges' discretion.

No part of the next dog/handler must be over the start line at the changeover; failure to observe this will incur a penalty of 20 faults.

An elimination will incur a penalty of 100 faults, a dropped baton will incur a penalty of 20 faults. Once a dog has been eliminated it cannot incur further faults. However, if either member of the pair fail to complete the course or either of the dogs foul the ring the pair will be disqualified.

The competition will involve changes of height of the obstacles being jumped by the medium/intermediate/large dogs at two stages during the class. The judge will decide which height of dog to start with and will announce the changes of height when relevant. It is the competitors' responsibility to be available accordingly. The course will be walked by everyone before the beginning of the class.

The final will consist of two rounds of jumping competition. The winners of the Discover Dogs Small / Mixi Pairs will be the pair with the least combined faults in the fastest combined time calculated over the two rounds of the final. Discover Dogs will be held alongside The London International Horse Show at London, ExCel in December. Car parking will not be provided by The Kennel Club.


Qualifying

Points will be awarded to the specific pair (consisting of two handlers with their dogs) which competes at the heat. Points are not transferable between different pair combinations.

Pairs will score 15 points for 1st place down to 1 point for 15th place. Points will be accumulated over all eight heats and the 15 pairs with the most points will go through to the final at Discover Dogs held alongside The London International Horse Show at London, Excel in December 2023.


Administration
